3) Scheduling Training Session.

Drinking water operators have priority over wastewater operators in the event a DW/WW course is at capacity.

The trainer will need to post the information on their website. In addition, if there are more drinking water operators registered than wastewater operators for a DW/WW course the training contractor will need to notify the wastewater operators of course unavailability.
