- Sanitation along the river corridor




North Fork CdA River Cooperative Recreation Plan



- Adopted by WAG August 2011
- Focuses on lower 35 miles of the river
 - Enaville upstream to Shoshone Creek
- Public and private land

CdA River Corridor Management Plan

- Management tool for the USFS
- Adopted June 2012
- Covers 150 miles along the North Fork and Little North Fork CdA River, Shoshone Creek, Lost Creek and Tepee Creek

Seamless implementation across jurisdictions

Goals

1. Provide recreation users with a variety of safe, enjoyable, high quality recreation experiences along the corridors of the North Fork and the Little North Fork of the Coeur d'Alene River.
2. Restore and rehabilitate riparian areas where resource damage has occurred and prevent new impacts associated with recreational use.

Goals continued...

3. Educate river corridor users about the river environment, safety, recreation opportunities, “Leave No Trace” ethics, and how to avoid negative environmental impacts.
4. Maximize efficiency and effectiveness by developing partnerships and volunteer opportunities with federal and state resource management agencies, counties, landowners, user groups and other entities.

Goals continued...

5. Encourage development and rehabilitation that supports the local economy by promoting existing local businesses and increasing local employment.

6. *Identify locations where development may be appropriate to improve access and safety for recreationists.*

Goals continued...

7. Provide a framework for identifying locations that need rehabilitation.

8. Maintain and restore watershed, riparian, and stream channel conditions needed to conserve fish habitat for westslope cutthroat trout, bull trout, and other aquatic species, and to provide a high quality recreational fishing experience on the North Fork of the Coeur d'Alene River.

USFS Site Prioritization

Sites prioritized using the following resources:

- Condition and use inventories of dispersed sites
- WAG Cooperative Recreation Plan
- Professional judgment (recreation, aquatics, etc.)

USFS River Ranger Program



- Forest Protection Officer
- Emphasis patrols on North Fork and Little North Fork
- Floated North Fork at least once a week
- Enforced rules and regulations
- Handed out 'Respect the River' educational materials and safety messages

Education

- Respect the River campaign
- Leave no Trace
- Pack it in/Pack it out
- River safety
- Fishing regulations
- Access and local amenities
- River ecology and habitat protection



Signs and Brochures

- 8 day-use and dispersed campsites with billboards
- Brochures developed and distributed to recreationists and local businesses





River Access Sites

- Designation of three launch/access sites:
 - Graham Creek dispersed site
 - Shoshone gauging station
 - Big Hank Meadow

River Clean-Up Day



- September 15, 2012
- Over 40 volunteers
- Removed garbage along 18 miles of the North Fork
- Albert's Landing provided food and refreshments for volunteers
- Plan on making this an annual event



Recycling Bins



- Boy Scout project
- 2 containers constructed that can each hold 2 fifty gallon drums
- Will be installed and utilized during 2013



Recycling Bags

- Centennial Distributing
 - 200 mesh recycling bags for use on the river
 - 400 plastic liners to use in the recycling bins



Adopt-a-Campsite/River Mile Program

- Groups or individuals may sign-up
- Must clean site(s) 4 times each year
- Duties include:
 - Clean out fire rings
 - Pick up garbage
 - Remove signs of human activity (such as tent trenching, ropes and wires, nails in trees, dismantling primitive benches, tables, toilets)
 - Break up excessive fire rings
- Sign placed at site will show who adopted it
