

FUNDING AUTHORIZATION AGREEMENT

On April 16, 2002, the State of Idaho, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, and the U.S. Department of Energy entered into an Agreement to Resolve Disputes ("Agreement") to settle disputes arising under the Federal Facility Agreement and Consent Order for activities at the Idaho National Engineering and Environmental Laboratory (now the Idaho National Laboratory). Paragraph 3.6 of the Agreement provides for the payment of an amount of money by DOE to the State to be held in a Trust Fund to be used to support Supplemental Environmental Projects ("SEPs"). Pursuant to the Agreement, the undersigned have been designated to represent the parties as Trustees.

Finding that the project described below will meet the criteria described in Paragraph 3.6 of the Agreement, the undersigned Trustees authorize the expenditure of the remainder of the Trust Fund (approximately \$30,500) as follows:

For the construction of a series of sediment basins and wetlands on I Coulee, an agricultural return drain on the Twin Falls Canal Company system, to reduce suspended sediment, phosphorous, nitrogen, and bacteria loads to the Snake River. The project will be managed by the Balanced Rock Soil Conservation District.

The expenditure of these Trust Fund moneys as described in this letter is to be in accordance with the terms, conditions and contingencies set forth in agreements to be executed with the recipient organizations. It is the understanding of the Trustees that the agreement will, as appropriate, ensure there are other funding sources, outside of SEP funds, to support ongoing operations, maintenance and administrative costs.

Pursuant to Paragraph 3.6 of the Agreement, the State of Idaho will be primarily responsible for implementing the SEP. This Funding Authorization Agreement may be signed in counterpart and shall become effective on the date of the last signature.
