

# Recycled Water On the Go – Fill ‘er up

**Abstract:** Recycled Water Fill Stations are another way to diversify your recycled water market among a larger spectrum of customers and increase familiarity with recycled water in your community. King County installed unstaffed recycled water fill station along its Brightwater distribution system in 2016. This presentation will discuss the engineering, operating, permitting, customer contracting and training considerations. In addition, this presentation will give an overview of the extensive recycled water fill station networks set up in California for commercial and residential users.
