

How long does it take?

It can take up to 2 weeks to obtain a U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) identification number in Idaho. In emergency situations, the process can be faster.

What information do I need?

The application form asks for the following:

- Name of facility
- Location and mailing addresses
- Land type
- Contact person name, address, email address, and phone number
- North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) code
- Owner's name, contact information, and date of becoming owner
- Operator's name, contact information, and date of becoming operator
- The type of hazardous waste or used oil handler you are
- The types of hazardous waste you handle if you are a hazardous waste handler (these are listed by waste code in the booklet containing the application form)
- Certification (signature) and date

The information booklet, *Notification of Regulated Waste Activity*, contains the application form, instructions for filling it out, and regulations that cover the identification and listing of hazardous wastes. To obtain this booklet, call (208) 373-0502.



What is an EPA identification number?

An EPA identification number is the number used by the state and federal government to keep track of hazardous waste and used oil handlers.

The number is twelve characters long. The first two characters are the postal code for the state, ID for Idaho. The third character can be a letter, such as D or R or a numeral. The next nine characters are numerals. An example of an Idaho EPA identification number is **IDR000123456**.

Who needs an EPA identification number?

- Hazardous waste generators (including episodic generators)
- Hazardous waste transporters
- Hazardous waste treatment, storage, and disposal facilities
- Hazardous waste fuel marketers
- Hazardous waste fuel burners
- Used oil fuel marketers
- Used oil fuel burners
- Used oil transporters and transfer facilities
- Used oil processors and re-refiners
- Large quantity universal waste handlers
- Subpart K academic lab activity
- Hazardous secondary material activity
- Recognized trader for hazardous waste exports and/or imports
- E-manifest broker

Do I already have an EPA identification number?

Your business in Idaho may have been assigned an EPA identification number in the past, and the number may still be valid. To find out if you already have a number, call the telephone number on the back of this brochure.

If you do have a number, you may have to update it before using it. You can update a number with the same form used to obtain a new EPA identification number.

Once I have an EPA identification number, what should I do with it?

Your EPA identification number must be included on the following:

- All shipping manifests for transporting hazardous wastes
- All biennial and annual reports that hazardous waste generators and owners and operators of hazardous waste treatment, storage, and disposal facilities must file with DEQ
- All applications for federal hazardous waste permits
- All other hazardous waste management reports and documentation required under Subtitle C of RCRA

You also may be asked for your number by other businesses.
