## Air Quality Notice - Lifted

The Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) has lifted an **Air Quality Notice** and is notifying residents of **Benewah**, **Bonner**, **Kootenai and Shoshone Counties** of improved air quality. A more active weather pattern has moved into the area and is forecast to continue through the weekend. Air quality is currently in the **GOOD to MODERATE** categories and is forecast to continue to improve. The pollutant of concern is Fine Particulate Matter (PM2.5).

## Health Impacts and Recommended Actions

When air quality is moderate, air quality is acceptable; however, people who are unusually sensitive to air pollution may experience health impacts and should consider reducing prolonged or heavy exertion.
