III. Twin Falls Canal Company

(Power-Point Presentation) Brian gave the group a little history on the canal company, and how everything began. He then explained how everything worked with recharge within the region. There were 80 thousand acres of recharge total. The canal company would like to do a lot more recharge without stealing water rights. There was a lot of water to recharge, this spring.

IV. TSS & Pollutant Trading

Mike Trabert-City of Twin Falls

(Power-Point Presentation) The City of Twin Falls is in the middle of their NPDES permit renewal. One of the changes within the permit is the TSS limit; it is switching over to the TMDL that is in the river. The city is looking at about 6 million dollars to put in a filtration system to clean out small amounts of solids, so they are looking at partnering the canal company and other agencies for removal sources before the solids hit the river. The city would like to have the TSS limit approved for the pollution trading within the Mid Snake Watershed, and have some kind of water based trading program instead of having to revisit the issue every time a TMDL is written. They would

like to have a TAC Committee (Technical Advisory Committee) be in charge of creating a policy that is good for the Mid Snake River.

EPA has a water based trading guidance document on how to write a pollution trading program. If the idea of the "TAC" is approved, the City would like to have both EPA and DEQ involved. All permit writing, for all of the point sources' is all part of the trading programs and will be incorporated within the NPDES permits.

V. Quagga Mussels

(See Hand out Pictures) Quagga Mussels reproduce twice a year, and they seem to colonize everywhere. When the Quagga Mussels colonize they eat all of the nutrients in the soils and leave nothing for other aquatic animals. Because they take up all of the nutrients, the macrophytes can take over. The Quagga Mussels have blocked off pipes and covered drain holes. They are becoming a huge problem within the water systems. Idaho Fish and Game has put out public notices and set up signs to make people aware of the problems to prevent anyone from bringing any vehicles that are infested with the mussels into the state. This is a state wide scare. The state has come with some guide lines for cleaning aquatic equipment. The Fish and Game along with other state agencies have put out mussel traps, hopefully to prevent some of the problems.
