

Errata for the *Upper (North Fork) Coeur d'Alene River Subbasin Temperature Total Maximum Daily Loads*

The Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) is providing errata for the *Upper (North Fork) Coeur d'Alene River Subbasin Temperature Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs)* approved by the Environmental Protection Agency in April 2014. That document was an addendum to the *2001 Subbasin Assessment and TMDLs of the North Fork Coeur d'Alene River*. The purpose of this document is to correct Table B, Table 3, Table 9, and Table B-3. These errata will be considered part of the final TMDL.

Errata corrections to the TMDL report are included below.

Pages xvii (Table B) and 56 (Table 9):

There were errors in the “Justification” column for five assessment units in the summary of temperature assessment outcomes for all 79 assessment units in the subbasin.

Therefore, DEQ has revised Table B and Table 9 as follows:

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There are errors in two footnotes for Table 3. Footnotes b and c should refer to Appendix B rather than Appendix C. Therefore, DEQ has revised Table B and Table 9 as follows:

^b Current Idaho temperature criteria for bull trout have not been approved or disapproved by EPA and therefore, the criteria adopted in 1998 are CWA-effective. See Appendix **C** **B** for discussion.

^c There are inconsistencies in the 1996 Bull Trout Conservation Plan (Batt 1996) identification of key watersheds referred to in IDAPA 58.01.02. See Appendix **C** **B** for discussion.

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There is an error in footnote C for Table B-3. The footnote should refer to Appendix B rather than Appendix C. Therefore, DEQ has revised Table B and Table 9 as follows:
