



## Notice of Receipt: Application to Renew the Calcined Solids Storage Facility Mixed Hazardous Waste Permit (EPA ID No. ID4890008952) (Docket No. 10HW-1604)

**Notice Issued:** June 15, 2016  
**What Is Proposed?** The Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) has received an application to renew the Hazardous Waste Management Act (HWMA)/Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Storage Partial Permit for the Calcined Solids Storage Facility (CSSF) at the Idaho Nuclear Technologies and Engineering Center (INTEC) located on the Idaho National Laboratory (INL), in Butte County, Idaho. The application was received on May 12, 2016.



The Department of Energy (DOE), Idaho Operations Office currently has an approved HWMA/RCRA Storage Partial Permit for the CSSF. This permit is due to expire on November 9, 2016. Fluor Idaho, LLC, is the operating contractor for the CSSF as of June 1, 2016.

**Describe The Facility Subject to Permitting:** The CSSF, located 45 miles west of Idaho Falls, is composed of seven bin sets designed to store high-activity mixed radioactive and hazardous wastes produced from calcination

in the Waste Calcining Facility (WCF), from 1963 through 1981, and the New Waste Calcining Facility (NWCF), from 1982 through 2000. Each bin set is comprised of an arrangement of stainless steel bins contained within a concrete vault. This permit reapplication allows for the continued use of Bin Sets 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 for storage and Bin Sets 6 and 7 for storage and to receive future waste transfers.

**What Are DEQ's Responsibilities?** DEQ is the regulatory agency that helps protect and enhance Idaho's water and air quality, and helps ensure proper management and disposal of hazardous and solid wastes. One way DEQ does this is by requiring permits for certain activities.

**What Legal Requirements Apply?** Idaho's rules for administrative procedure require that DEQ provide an owner or operator and the public, through a newspaper notice, the opportunity to submit written comments on the draft permit.

**What Happens Next?** DEQ will review the renewal application for technical completeness and identify any deficiencies to ensure compliance with all applicable regulations. Upon determination that the application is complete, DEQ will draft a permit and allow interested parties to review the draft permit, and submit comments prior to making a final decision on the permit.
