Mr. Bracken is the Legal Counsel for the Western States Water Council, which serves as a resource and advisor to the governors of 18 western states on water policy issues. As Legal Counsel, he works with Council members, who are appointed by their respective governors, to develop and implement policies and initiatives on water issues affecting the western United States, including water reuse, exempt domestic wells, and Indian water rights settlements, among other issues. He has also published hundreds of articles on water-related legislation and litigation as the Editor of *Western States Water*, a weekly, nationally-circulated newsletter focused on water policy. In addition to various other articles and reports, he is the author of “Water Reuse in the West,” an extensive report focused on water reuse regulations, barriers, and programs in 17 western states scheduled for publication this spring in the *West-Northwest Journal of Environmental Law and Policy*. Prior to joining the Council, Mr. Bracken worked in private practice as an attorney and mediator, focusing on alternative dispute resolution. He is a graduate of Brigham Young University, where he received a B.A. in English and minored in Political Science. Mr. Bracken received his J.D. from the University of Utah’s S.J. Quinney College of Law, where he served as the managing editor of a law journal.
